In the prequalification stage, only the technical bids will be opened and examined and in the second stage, the financial bids will be opened, only of those who fulfill the technical requirements.

4. Parties that are applying should have at least 05 years of experience in undertaking market studies and must submit the following documents as part of technical bid:

- c) Hard Copy of sample report of market study already conducted
